The Chaplaincy Team Here for You

The Chaplaincy Team is part of Kettering General Hospital NHS Foundation Trust. We are based in the hospital and work across all areas of the Trust. Chaplains are members of hospital staff who are trained to provide spiritual, pastoral and religious support to all patients and visitors as well as to all the staff working within the Trust.

A message from the Chaplains

The Chaplains regularly visit the hospital wards so we might see you during your stay in hospital.

If you would like us to come and see you on the ward or in a quiet area, please ask the nurse to contact us. We are also available to support your family.

Coming into Hospital

We know this can be a worrying time full of questions such as:-

- Am I going to be alright?
- What will the tests show?
- How long will I be in hospital?
- How will I cope?

You may also have concerns about your home, family, about your job or the future. It helps to talk these things through with someone who has the time to listen. Whether you think of yourself as religious or not, the Chaplains are available for you.

We can also contact your own religious leader for you, just ask.

Hospital Chapel

Our Chapel is situated near the Main Entrance and is always open, day and night.

A Morning Service is held in the Chapel every Sunday at 11:00am. You can ask to be brought down in a wheelchair or make your own way if you and the ward staff think it is safe for you to do so.

Also on Sundays, the Chaplains and their assistants take Holy Communion to the wards for any patient who asks for it.

There is a brief Communion Service in the Chapel on Tuesdays at 8.30am.

Muslim Prayers are held on Friday lunchtimes.

A Multi-Faith Prayer Room, with washing facilities alongside, is located in the main hospital courtyard.
